CREATIVE ARTS

GEOGRAPHY – Factors that Shape Places

Students investigate how people change the natural environment in Australia and other places around the world. They also explore how the environment influences the human characteristics of places. Students examine ways people influence the characteristics of places, including the management of spaces.

SCIENCE – Forces

Stage 3 of the Physical World strand focuses on the difference between contact and non-contact forces and how energy is transformed from one form to another. This strand develops students' abilities to design, test and evaluate a product or system that demonstrates energy transformation, further developing an understanding of the interrelationship between force and energy.
