Religion

PDHPE

Unit of Work titled: 'How does resilience help us overcome challenges.' This unit is designed to support students to recognise, describe, promote and apply inclusive behaviours which foster respectful relationships. We are also continuing the Open Parachute' program to explore friendships, emotions, relationships, strategies etc

Visual Arts

Children will explore the elements of drawing, painting, sculpture, and photography through our focus on two artists: Ricky Maynard and Trent White.

Our art focus will be on nature and other landscapes. The students will also be doing music in their Creative Arts lessons.

Inquiry
